

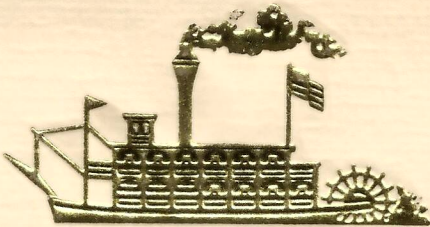

Dear Sir:

I wholeheartedly support the Bureau's proposal to amend 27 CFR Part 9 to include Clarksburg in the list of American Viticultural Areas.

Part of that area is in my Congressional District, and I am familiar with many of the people involved in the wine industry in and around Sacramento and with their petition to BATF. The Clarksburg area produces excellent wines clearly meriting an appellation. Consumers will also benefit from this action by the Bureau, through their ability to identify the high quality wines of this area.

There are three minor corrections which I would suggest to your announcement in the Federal Register, all under the "Boundaries" section of the proposed amendment: 1) Reference number (10) should, I believe, end with Section 14, rather than Section 4; and 2 & 3) "Borrows Ave." mentioned in reference numbers (11) and (12) should be spelled "Burrows Ave."

If there is any additional way in which I might assist the Bureau in its consideration of this proposal, I would be most pleased to do so.


I would like to offer my support for the creation of the Clarksburg Viticultural Area.

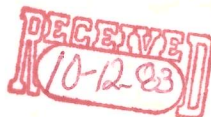

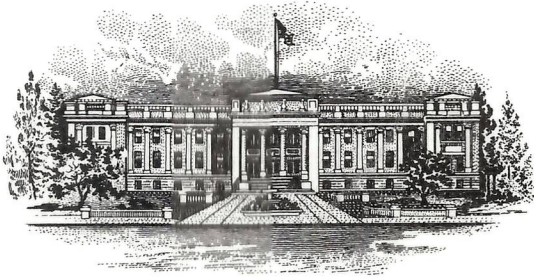


