Description of wine Galil Mountain Rosé 2012

A dry and aromatic wine with characters of fresh strawberry, rose blossom, citrus and spices. Refreshing and vivacious with high acidity.

The growing season that preceded the 2012 harvest began with a cold, rainy winter that led to deep hibernation of the vines, and satisfied the need for cold conditions that are essential for growing quality grapes. The cold winter led to a relatively late arousal of the vines, but a hot spring accelerated their development, enabling the harvest to begin in August as in average years. The season's climate was characterized by comfortable temperatures enabling optimal vineyard growth and high quality grapes.
